



WSIPC RFP 26-01 Technology Devices, Related Products and Services

RFP Bid Addendum I

August 11, 2026

The following corrections, questions, and clarifications are provided concerning **WSIPC RFP 26-01 Technology Devices, Related Products and Services**. Paraphrasing of the relevant questions posed to the WSIPC RFP Contract Administrator have been included as appropriate.

QUESTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS:

Q1 – We currently have an awarded contract under RFP 20-01 Computer and Hardware Equipment, is this RFP 26-01 replacing it or is it overlapping it.

A1 – No, RFP 26-01 Technology Devices, Related Products and Services does not replace RFP 20-01 Computer and Hardware Equipment. The two contracts are intended to coexist, with RFP 26-01 providing an additional contracting vehicle for Technology Devices, Related Products and Services. Participation in RFP 26-01 is optional and does not affect a vendor's current award status under RFP 20-01.

Q2 – Do website and communications solutions fall under the scope of RFP 26-01 as part of the reference to "related technology products and services designed to support evolving technology environments across education and public-sector organizations"?

A2: No. Website and communications solutions are not included within the scope of RFP 26-01 Technology Devices, Related Products and Services. Such offerings would fall under a separate category and are not being solicited through this RFP.

Q3 – Is being licensed/registered to do business in Washington State a hard eligibility requirement to submit a proposal or be awarded a contract, or is this simply a disclosure question that factors into the Vendor Capabilities evaluation?

A3 – Washington State business registration is not a requirement to submit a proposal. However, any Vendor awarded a contract must be properly registered and authorized to transact business in Washington State prior to execution of the contract and commencement of performance.

Vendors submitting proposals should provide the requested business license documentation in accordance with **Section 3.3.1, Item 5:**

5. With your proposal, include a copy of your active Business License. In accordance with, RCW 23.95 Uniform Business Code - WA, each distinct entity (with its own corporate identity and tax ID) must be separately registered to transact business in Washington State.

Out-of-state Vendors that are not currently registered to transact business in Washington State should clearly identify their current state of registration and business status in their proposal and, if awarded, must obtain the required Washington State registration prior to contract execution and performance.

Q4 – We already have an active contract with WSIPC for WSIPC RFP 24-01 Student Safety Solutions, which is active until 12/31/28 with options for renewal thereafter. If all of our products are already listed on the Student Safety Solutions contract, do we also need to respond to RFP 26-01?

A4 – No. If all of the Vendor's products and solutions are currently included under its active WSIPC RFP 24-01 Student Safety Solutions contract, the Vendor is not required to submit a proposal for those same products and solutions under RFP 26-01.

However, RFP 24-01 is subject to its current contract term and renewal provisions, and there is no guarantee of extension or renewal beyond its current term. Vendors seeking coverage beyond RFP 24-01 may submit a proposal under RFP 26-01.

Q5 – Would interactive flat panels qualify as a display category in your evaluations?

A5 – Yes, Interactive flat panels are considered in scope as a type of monitor/display technology and classroom collaboration device.
